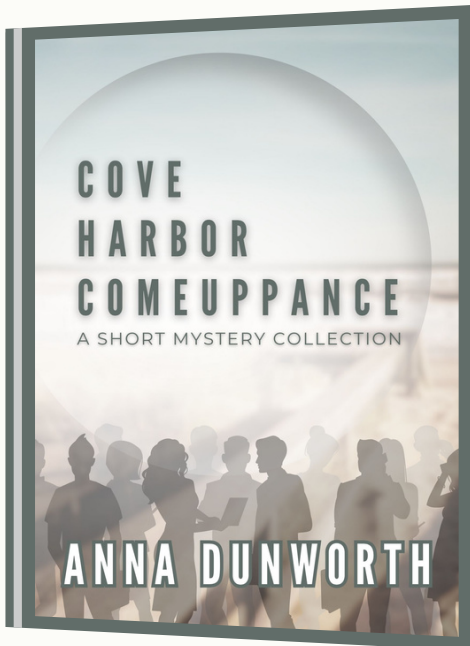


COVE HARBOR COMEUPPANCE
